## **FACULTY COUNCIL**

A meeting of Faculty Council was held on Tuesday, May 24, 2016, at 5:15 p.m. in Room 170, at the Faculty of Dentistry University of Toronto.

- **WELCOME:** The Chair, Laura Dempster, welcomed everyone to the meeting and reminded everyone to sign in.
- **MINUTES:** The Chair asked if there were any errors or omissions in the minutes of March 25, 2015. One minor change was noted to add Dr. Peter Judd as attending the March meeting. On a motion by Dr. Richmond, seconded by Dr. Ganss, Council approved the change as requested.

#### PRESENTATION:

- Dr. Ganss outlined his plans for his new role as Vice-Dean, Research, as of July 1, 2016. In the past year, a number of first steps have been taken, including supporting faculty development from a research perspective (JF-RAMP program). With the new organizational structure, Research and Education are equal within the Faculty's mandate. Research's main focus will be to improve infrastructure and to continue helping our junior and tenure-stream researchers with grant success and to improve the area of what the university now calls "knowledge mobilization", i.e. how does what we do and know benefit patients or the commercialization of technologies.
- Dr. Ganss presented on the Faculty of Dentistry's new Internal Grant Peer Review Program being developed in conjunction with Farah Thong. This is to respond to increasing pressure and competitiveness with grant funding. Benefits to internal research review programs can improve readiness, quality and success rates for grant proposals, as well as build collegiality and collaborations. In addition, they boost organizational reputation and improve tenure success. Looking at our statistics, it appears we have researchers with great, but smaller projects that need to be developed into larger grant proposals. The focus will be on targeting the Tri-Council funding (CIHR, NSERC, SSHRC) as they have fixed submission dates, are used to calculate our share of Canada Research Chairs, and have the highest impact in tenure decisions. Expansion to other granting agencies could follow. The program will be initiated in June 2016 to match submission deadlines in the fall. This process will help our faculty members submit high quality grant proposals, increase chances for success by providing constructive feedback, support junior faculty, and create a database of research activities to help promote collaborations, and enhance the reputation of the Faculty's research enterprise. The request is that all researchers with appointments of 50% FTE or above will participate when submitting NSERC and CIHR grant applications as lead investigators. Timelines will begin 8 weeks in advance of funding deadline, and the process will include a peer review process to incorporate feedback prior to submission. The Research Committee will oversee and evaluate the program annually, and submit an annual report to the Dean. Questions were raised regarding the 8 week schedule and the tight timelines. Dr. Ganss agreed, and noted this will be evaluated this year, and that should investigators want to start earlier they are welcome to. Questions were raised regarding whether this will just create more paperwork. Dr. Ganss noted that the forms are being created to be as short and easy as possible, and feedback is welcome. Further details will be discussed at Research Rounds.

<u>Undergraduate Education Committee Reports:</u> Dr. Lai presented the reports from the March and May meetings. He also noted that Dr. Spielman, Associate Dean of Academic Affairs and New York University will be presenting on June 7, 2016, and all faculty are welcome to attend. Dr. Lai also outlined his plans for his new role as Vice-Dean, Education. He will meet with all faculty members regarding their teaching, including both undergraduate and graduate, and to explore new ideas in teaching and evaluation. He will also be focusing on faculty development, especially in regards to assessment, in conjunction with CTSI and ADEA. He noted that a number of courses are being formalized to ensure our students' learning is enriched through service-learning.

On a motion by Dr. Lai, seconded by Dr. Stavro, Council accepted the recommendation of the Undergraduate Education Committee that the new course proposal for Community-based Service Learning be accepted as presented. Dr. Posluns will be course director, and the rotations will focus on Greater Toronto Area locations.

On a motion by Dr. Lai, seconded by Dr. Cornell, Council accepted the recommendation of the Undergraduate Education Committee that the new course proposal for Dental Outreach Global Services be accepted as presented. This course formalizes what our students are already doing internationally at various sites (e.g. Uganda and Ethiopia), and has limited enrolment. Dr. Azarpazhooh will be course director. Dr. Sessle noted that he has relationships with universities in Uganda, and that they could be a potential engagement partner moving forward, along with other global engagement sites. Dr. Stavro inquired as to how these students are supported; Dean Haas noted that with small level participation it is currently funded through the Annual Fund, but as the program grows funding will need to be established. Dr. Hinz asked about student selection, and Dr. Lai noted this will be established by the course director.

On a motion by Dr. Lai, seconded by Dr. Cornell, Council accepted the recommendation of the Undergraduate Education Committee that the new course proposal for Dental Outreach Community Services be accepted as presented. This course will focus on Ontario outreach sites, e.g. Simcoe County and Haliburton County. The course will formalize and expand on what students are already doing, with limited enrolment. Dr. Azarpazhooh will be the course director.

On a motion by Dr. Lai, seconded by Dr. Stavro, Council accepted the recommendation of the Undergraduate Education Committee that the new course proposal for Princess Margaret Hospital Clinical Rotation be accepted as presented. A course provides a new opportunity for students to provide dental care to oncology patients during the after-hours clinic (5:30 pm - 8:30pm), with limited enrolment. Dr. Robert Wood will be the course director.

Constitution and Nominations Report: Dean Haas presented this report. He referred Council to the "Nominations Proposed for the Standing Committees of Faculty Council" document in the Faculty Council package, explaining that the asterisks in this report referred to people who had been nominated for membership on specific standing committees. Dean Haas noted that the C&N will be meeting more often in the new academic year, and will be looking at new committee structures and the introduction of more appropriate committees to support the new faculty structure – we will utilize the existing constitution for 2016-2017 as this will be a transition year.

<u>Hospital Relations Committee:</u> Dean Haas presented this report, on behalf of the Chair, Dr. Carmichael. It was noted that Dr. Karen Lee, the new Chief of Dentistry at St. Michael's will be joining this committee. It was also noted that this committee will now oversee the Hospital Dental Residency program including the seminar series. The Committee will also be investigating a possible partnership with Baycrest.

Graduate and Postgraduate Committee Report: Dr. Manolson presented this report, referring Council to the documentation in the Faculty Council Package. It was noted that there are four new scholarships to approve. The final recommendation is regarding a formal policy change for graduate student vacation, to appear in the calendar and in the memorandum of agreement for students and supervisors, which provides for up to two weeks of vacation. The School of Graduate Studies has no policy, but many faculties are aligning with general policies. It was noted that if

students are required to be here during Reading Week, they are entitled to time off in lieu. Conference attendance is not considered to be vacation.

On a motion by Dr. Manolson, seconded by Dr. Richmond, Council accepted the recommendation of the Graduate and Postgraduate Committee that the PPEF – David Locker Doctoral Scholarship in Dental Public Health award record be accepted as presented.

On a motion by Dr. Manolson, seconded by Ms. Edghill, Council accepted the recommendation of the Graduate and Postgraduate Committee that the David Locker Graduate Travel Award in Dental Public Health award record be accepted as presented.

On a motion by Dr. Manolson, seconded by Dr. Quiñonez, Council accepted the recommendation of the Graduate and Postgraduate Committee that the David Locker Graduate Scholarship in Dental Public Health award be accepted as presented.

On a motion by Dr. Manolson, seconded by Dr. E. Lam, Council accepted the recommendation of the Graduate and Postgraduate Committee that the Dr. Michael Pharoah Graduate Scholarship in Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology award be accepted as presented.

On a motion by Dr. Manolson, seconded by Dr. E. Lam, Council accepted the recommendation of the Graduate and Postgraduate Committee that the Graduate Student Vacation Policy be accepted as presented.

<u>Undergraduate Grading Practices Committee:</u> Dean Haas presented the report from the April 12, 2016 meeting, as included in the Faculty Council documentation.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

#### **Dean's Report:**

**Honours and Awards:** Dean Haas noted he will announce the winners of the W.W. Wood Award and the Bruce Hord Teacher Awards, as well as the first-ever Faculty of Dentistry Staff Excellence award at our faculty and staff Summer luncheon on June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016. In other faculty news, Ze'ev Seltzer has been awarded an Honorary Professorship at the University of Heidelberg, Germany.

**Research Awards:** two of Dentistry's researchers have won Connaught Funds from the University of Toronto. Distinguished Professor Boris Hinz won a \$100,000 Connaught Fund to further the development and commercialization of a myocardial testing platform. Professor D. Lamwon a Summer Connaught, worth \$150,000, for his plans to start a Summer Institute in Pain. We should be especially proud of these results, as there were only 9 Connaughts awarded across the University, and of those only 1 Summer Connaught was awarded.

Student Awards: Endodontics Graduate Resident Annie Shrestha won a \$25,000 research grant from the American Association of Endodontists. Annie Shrestha, Craig Bellamy and Brent Moore also placed in the top 10 in the "Oral Research" category at the recent AAE meeting in San Francisco. Graduate student Gillian Layton (and co-author Anil Kishen)'s paper was the recent winner of the 2016 JOE award in the Basic Science: Technology category. The Canadian Academy of Pediatric Dentistry gave out awards to 3 of our own pediatric residents. Molly Erlich won the 3M Oral Care Graduate Student Research Award. Ali Sigal has been awarded the Keith Titley Pediatric Dental Graduate Scholarship, and Leena Chohan was runner-up; Ali has also been awarded the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry's Resident Recognition Award for "doing innovative and interesting activities in her training program." Hendrik Doering, a second year Periodontology Resident, has been awarded First in the inaugural Canadian Academy of Periodontology Literature Review Competition. Kester Ng, DDS-3 was this year's winner of the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology's student essay contest, which he wrote on pregabalin and gabapentin for pain management. He was invited to New York to receive his award. Also, pointing to the high caliber of research our summer students are performing, a total of 7 of our incoming Summer Research Program students have been awarded major funding for their participation in the Program: 5 students were awarded CIHR funds (Zoha Anjum, Myra Nina Caballero, Richard Yi He, Tony He, and Boaz Wong) and another two students have been awarded NSERC funding (Madeleine Di Gregorio and Linwen Huang). Congratulations to all.

**World Biomaterials Congress:** this was recently held in Montreal and was chaired by Dr. Paul Santerre. It was a resounding success. There is a video from the Congress that will be circulated on our own social media channels in the near future.

New appointments: Dean Haas announced 2 new faculty members will join us as of July 1st. During our recent search in the area of dental sciences, we were fortunate to attract a very large number of truly outstanding candidates, which made selection very difficult. These candidates were so exceptional that we pursued the possibility of hiring two. This was made possible by delaying one of our other planned searches in oral radiology – thanks to the dedication and extra work being provided by Dr. E. Lam – and with the permission of the Provost, we were able to accomplish this. One is Dr. Massieh Moayedi, who is currently at University College, London, where he is a Honourary Research Fellow in the Department of Neuroscience, Physiology and Pharmacology. He earned his BSc at the University of Ottawa and his PhD in Neuroscience at U of T under the supervision of Dr. Karen Davis. Dr. Moayedi's research focuses on pain mechanisms using structural and functional brain imaging. He will be a very welcome addition to our other strong pain researchers here at the Faculty. The second is Dr. Karina Carneiro, who is currently finishing a postdoctoral Fellowship at the University of California, San Francisco. She studies DNA-based biomaterials and biosensors. Dr. Carneiro completed her BSc in Chemistry at Mount Saint Vincent and Dalhousie Universities, and her PhD at McGill University in the Department of Chemistry. She will undoubtedly be an exceptional addition to our outstanding biomaterials researchers. Dean Haas thanked the Provost for her strong support of our own efforts to both strengthen the research caliber, and the diversity, of our faculty.

**Prostho Search:** we have one search currently underway in prosthodontics. The two short-listed candidates will be providing their lectures to the faculty next week. You have already received an announcement regarding the first talk, and the second will be sent out by e-mail later this week.

#### **Strategic Plan updates:**

**Priorities affecting infrastructure:** as explained at our information session on May 2<sup>nd</sup> on infrastructure, our Faculty's proposal has now been included as part of the University of Toronto's application to the Federal Government's Strategic Initiative Fund. If successful, this will provide matching funds to facilitate a renewal of the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> floors of our building. As mentioned in our update, this project must be completed by April 2018, which means we are starting preparing for this renovation immediately. This renovation will affect everyone here, as we will need to find efficiencies in our use of space, but particularly those on the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> floors who will have to move offices and share lab space. As a reminder, "Clean out days" for the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> floors will take place May 30<sup>th</sup> and May 31<sup>st</sup>. We will keep everyone up to date about the progress of these plans as more information becomes available. There will be monthly updates via the Faculty's enewsletters. As well, Dr. Ganss will be communicating with the Pl's who are directly affected. Other individual groups who are affected will be consulted accordingly.

**Implementation Committee:** the Strategic Plan Implementation Committee has been meeting and is now preparing the report on the progress made on this year's Strategic Priorities, and planning the new priorities for 2016-17. We will be finalizing this report by June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

**New Academic Structure:** the Faculty's new academic structure will take effect on July 1st, with new academic administrative positions, and without the current discipline structure. The Vice Dean, Education and the Associate Deans, Undergraduate Education and Graduate Education will work together, as well as with course directors, to facilitate a more streamlined delivery of the educational programs. Starting July 1st, Course Directors will assume the responsibility of organizing and running their courses. All academic questions for the DDS program, from that point forward, should be directed to the Vice-Dean, Education, Dr. Jim Lai, or the Associate Dean, Undergraduate Education, Dr. Grace Bradley. As of July 1st, all questions regarding the graduate specialty programs should be directed to the Associate Dean, Graduate Education, Dr. Ernest Lam. The mentoring of faculty members will become a priority for the Vice Deans. The Vice

Dean, Research will actively assure mentoring and faculty development of all professorial stream faculty with respect to research. The Vice Dean, Education will actively assure mentoring and faculty development of all faculty with respect to teaching. This is of particular importance for those who are pre-tenure. The new structure should facilitate interdisciplinary research and education. As needed, the Vice Dean, Education will help facilitate coordination between undergraduate and graduate programs. Dean Haas thanked all of the Discipline Heads for their hard work and dedication over the years. He noted we are going into a period of transition and administrative support staff still will require your supervision. As a result of the upcoming change to the academic structure, we are conducting a review of the current administrative support positions in order to evaluate whether or not the current structure is best suited to meet the needs of the Faculty and to support the new academic model and the Faculty's strategic plan. At this time, we are just collecting information and recommendations will be forthcoming. Dean Haas will be meeting with the administrative support staff next week to provide them with an update as well. The next year will be a year of transition, and Dean Haas thanked everyone in advance for their patience while the restructuring advances.

#### **Upcoming events:**

**Graduation Reception:** following the success from last year's inaugural graduation reception hosted jointly by the Faculty and the Alumni Association, we will again be hosting this event on Tuesday, May 31<sup>st</sup> at the Sheraton Centre. Please RSVP to Alumni Office regarding your attendance.

**Convocation:** on June 3<sup>th</sup>, in the morning we will have our Awards and Licensing ceremony at Hart House, and during the afternoon Dentistry's Convocation will take place. For those of you who have RSVP'd, I look forward to seeing you at this event.

**Summer Luncheon:** our annual lunch for staff and faculty will be held on Thursday, June 30<sup>th</sup>. At this event we will honour our retirees and teaching award and staff award winners. We are looking into planning a BBQ. I look forward to seeing you there.

<u>Delegation of Summer Authority at Faculty Council</u>. The Chair informed Council that any decisions reached during Summer meetings would be reported to the first Faculty Council meeting in the Fall.

On a motion by Dean Haas, seconded by Dr. Sessle, Council approved the motion that between the last meeting of Faculty Council and the first meeting in the next academic session, proposals requiring approval of Faculty Council would be made under Summer Executive Authority by the Executive Committee.

**IN CAMERA:** The Chair asked the student members of Faculty Council, and any members with a potential conflict of interest to leave the meeting for the "In Camera" session, as student grades would be discussed.

The Report of the Undergraduate Grading Practices Committee held on May 20, 2016, was distributed. Dean Haas presented this report, showing grade distribution charts, individual student grades and awards documents via a PowerPoint presentation. The Chair reminded Council that all content of the PowerPoint presentation, including the information on student awards, was to remain confidential.

<u>Year 1</u> – Moved by Dean Haas and seconded by Dr. Posluns, Council accepted the report as presented, noting that 95 students were eligible to proceed to Year II, and accepted the marks and grade distributions as presented.

<u>Year III</u> – Moved by Dean Haas and seconded by Dr. E. Lam, Council accepted the report as presented, noting that 111 students were eligible to proceed to Year IV, including the approval of grades, grade distributions and awards as noted.

<u>Year IV</u> – Moved by Dean Haas and seconded by Dr. Cornell, Council accepted the report as presented, noting that as of today, 99 students were eligible to convocate.

<u>Honours List 2016:</u> It was noted that 63 (53%) of the students will be graduating with "Honours" standing.

**<u>IDAPP:</u>** Moved by Dean Haas and seconded by Dr. Cornell, Council accepted the report as presented, noting that 23 students were eligible to transfer to DDS III.
