A MESSAGE FROM THE INTERIM DEAN

This fifth edition of the Dean's Annual Report is based on the 2021–22 year, led by dean Haas. I am honoured to deliver this report in my role as interim dean of this wonderful Faculty.



Under dean Haas's leadership, 2021–22 saw many infrastructure updates, including the opening of the Faculty's satellite clinic at 777 Bay St., a renovation to our auditorium and the opening of our new medical device reprocessing facility.

The Faculty of Dentistry has also continued to rise in international stature, ranking #1 in Canada and #34 in the world in the QS World University Rankings 2022. In July 2022, the Shanghai Academic Ranking of World Universities ranked the Faculty #1 in Canada and #23 in the world.

This year also saw many noteworthy promotions and awards within our Faculty. Eszter Somogyi-Ganss was promoted to associate professor, teaching stream, with continuing status. Iacopo Cioffi, Marco Magalhaes and Massieh Moayedi were all promoted to associate professor, with tenure. And Amir Azarpazhooh, Laura Dempster and Céline Lévesque were promoted to full

professors. Deepika Chugh and Reza Termei were the recipients of Bruce Hord Master Teaching Awards and Amir Azarpazhooh received the W. W. Wood Award for excellence in dental education from the Association of Canadian Faculties of Dentistry.

As I look ahead to my year as interim dean, I am pleased to see the return of more in-person classes. 2022–2023 will see also a return to in-person activities and I look forward to attending a Dentantics show again, the ODA cup and the Great Alumni Event in the new year.


Notably, the restriction for aerosol-generating procedures (AGPs) in enclosed operatories only ended recently. This is a significant step toward more normal operations in the Faculty's undergraduate and postgraduate clinics. While the satellite clinic was essential to provide extra capacity for AGP procedures due to COVID-19 restrictions, it continues to serve as an essential clinic space while Lab 4 is being renovated this year. All the Canadian dental faculties are working together to ensure that the government, in planning the new federal dental program, understands that we are a critical, foundational component of health systems. We not only train future dental professionals, but provide oral health care, particularly to more vulnerable populations, and advance dental research.




