Assistant Professor, Tenure Stream – Dental Public Health

Application Deadline: February 15, 2024

The Faculty of Dentistry at the University of Toronto invites applications for a full-time tenure stream position in Dental Public Health. The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor, with an anticipated start date of July 1, 2024.

This search aligns with the University's commitment to strategically and proactively promote diversity among our community members ([Statement on Equity, Diversity & Excellence](#)). Recognizing that Black, Indigenous, and other Racialized communities have experienced inequities that have developed historically and are ongoing, we strongly welcome and encourage candidates from those communities to apply.

Preference will be given to candidates who self-identify as Indigenous. Recognizing that there are a variety of terms that potential candidates may use to self-identify, the University uses the term "Indigenous" in this search, which forms part of the U of T Response to Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission, to encompass the people of Turtle Island, including those who identify as First Nations, Métis, Inuk (Inuit), Alaska Native, Native American, and Native Hawaiian people.

Candidates must have earned a DDS/DMD/BDS degree, or equivalent, and a PhD degree in an area related to Dental Public Health by the time of appointment, or shortly thereafter, with a demonstrated record of excellence in research and teaching. The candidate must have successfully completed specialty training in Dental Public Health in a program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada or the Commission on Dental Accreditation in the United States, or a non-accredited program and subsequently successfully completed qualification through a Dental Specialty Assessment and Training Program. The successful candidate must be eligible for or have obtained licensure as a dental public health specialist with the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, and must have practical experience in public health. We are particularly interested in candidates who hold a Fellowship in the Royal College of Dentists of Canada in Dental Public Health. We seek candidates whose research and teaching interests complement and enhance our existing departmental strengths, particularly in the areas of oral health promotion, access to oral healthcare, and public health policy. The successful candidate will be expected to pursue innovative and independent research, and to establish an outstanding, competitive, and externally funded research program.

Candidates must provide evidence of research excellence which can be demonstrated by a record of publications in top-ranked and field relevant journals or forthcoming publications meeting high

international standards, the submitted research statement, presentations at significant conferences, awards and accolades, and strong endorsements from referees.

Evidence of excellence in teaching will be provided through teaching accomplishments, the teaching dossier (with required materials as outlined below) submitted as part of the application, as well as strong letters of reference.

The candidate is expected to contribute to both the undergraduate and graduate programs in Dental Public Health and assume the role of Program Director of the Dental Public Health graduate program.

The candidate is expected to develop Dental Public Health curriculum and research content that embeds the principles of equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) and explores oral health inequities. The candidate should bring novel approaches to both leverage and advance collaboration among existing research areas within the Faculty of Dentistry and externally. The successful candidate will be expected to pursue innovative and independent research at the highest international level and to establish an outstanding, competitive, and externally funded research program. Applicability of their research to the practice of public health is expected.

Salary will commensurate with qualifications and experience.

As the oldest and most established dental school in Canada, U of T Dentistry has been a trailblazer in dental specialties and clinical innovations. Throughout the twentieth century, the Faculty set a standard of innovation and excellence, pioneering many firsts in the quickly evolving field of dentistry – and beyond. The Faculty is home to all of the specialty programs recognized by the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario (RCDSO), the Royal College of Dentists of Canada (RCD), and The National Dental Examining Board of Canada (NDEB) – beginning with Orthodontics in 1945. Its Anaesthesia, Dental Public Health, and Oral Radiology programs are the only programs in Canada specific to these areas of training. Additionally, the Faculty is one of the few dental schools in the world with exceptionally strong basic science research focused on oral health. Applicants must submit a cover letter; a current curriculum vitae; a research statement outlining current and future research interests; a recent writing sample; and a teaching dossier including a teaching statement, sample course materials, and teaching evaluations.

Applicants must provide the name and contact information of three references. The University of Toronto's recruiting tool will automatically solicit and collect letters of reference from each referee
