#### **Message from the Interim Dean**

I am pleased to present the seventh edition of Dean's Annual Report. I am also honoured to share that my appointment as interim dean has been extended until June 30, 2025.

The 2023–2024 year was filled with many academic achievements, essential infrastructure upgrades and events that help foster our wonderful community.

Lab 4, the simulation lab, is the latest space in our building to undergo renovations. There were components of the lab that dated back to when the building was first constructed, and it needed a change to keep pace with dental technology. We are excited to see how the new Lab 4 will better prepare our students to perform on live patients in clinic in their third and fourth years. We are grateful for the generous donors who support the school's space renewal efforts, including the naming of the new Sim Lab stations. Next, we plan to upgrade Clinic 2, our main patient clinic. We are currently fundraising and are thankful to those who have helped get this project underway.

In all our clinics, we continue to serve patients experiencing barriers to accessing dental care. This includes participating in the new Canadian Dental Care Plan to ensure we can provide affordable treatment to those in need.

Research Day and Education Day were two highlights of this academic year. Research Day is dedicated to highlighting all of the incredible work being done at our Faculty and included poster competitions, oral presentations and the 3-Minute Thesis competition. Our annual Education Day had a focus on artificial intelligence for dental educators as well as an education research and innovation showcase, a presentation on the art of teaching and a panel on best practices in teaching and learning.

This year also saw many well-deserved honours within our Faculty. Professor Michael Glogauer 9T3, 9T9 Dip Perio, 9T9 PhD was the winner of CADR-ACFD National Dental Research Award for 2024. Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream Kristina Perschbacher and Clinical Instructor Michael Krawczuk were

# **Students**

Year after year, the Faculty of Dentistry attracts top student talent. In 2023, Doctor of Dental Surgery applications increased by 9.3 per cent from the previous year. This year, we received 212 graduate applications, an increase of 5.4 per cent over the previous year.



#### **Clinics & Patients**



The Faculty of Dentistry is continuing to upgrade its facilities in order to provide the best in student learning and patient care. The Faculty has registered with the Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) to ensure people who need it can access affordable treatment. The Dental Public Health graduate program has been conducting studies to address barriers to accessing dental care, even with private insurance. This type of information is critical to ensuring the CDCP continues to evolve to address the needs of all Canadians.

The latest renovation of the building's simulation lab is an example of a space that will enhance both the student and patient experience. This lab is set up to simulate a dental operatory, allowing first- and second-year DDS students to develop the hand skills to treat patients for the later years of the program. "It is critical that the skills the students learn in preclinic are transferable to clinic and then to practice," says James Posluns, Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream, and Director of Clinical Affairs. Keeping the Faculty's facilities up-to-date is imperative in preparing students for success later.

# **Featured Publications**

#### **IMPACT FACTOR: 2.6\***

Mona Abdelrehim and Sonica Singhal's research paper *Is private insurance enough to address barriers to accessing dental care? Findings from a Canadian population-based study* appeared in *BMC Oral Health* in 2024.

This paper showed that certain populations with private dental insurance, based on their socio-demographics, still experience financial barriers to dental care and report inferior oral health, particularly individuals aged 20 to 39 and those with annual household incomes less than \$40,000.

#### **IMPACT FACTOR: 6\***

Christopher McCulloch et al.'s research paper **TRPV4 regulates** *β***1 integrin***mediated cell-matrix adhesions and collagen remodeling* appeared in *The FASEB Journal* in 2023.

McCulloch's lab uncovered a new mechanism by which TRPV4, a mechanically sensitive plasma membrane channel, regulates extracellular matrix (ECM) collagen remodelling in periodontal tissue. This study adds to the understanding of ECM, which is crucial to preserving tissue integrity and function.

#### **IMPACT FACTOR: 42.1\***

Michael Glogauer and Erin Watson's research paper *Development and Standardization of an Osteoradionecrosis Classification System in Head and Neck Cancer: Implementation of a Risk-Based Model* appeared in *Journal of Clinical Oncology* in 2024.

The authors developed a staging and grading system (ClinRad) for osteoradionecrosis of the jaw, which is a debilitating condition that affects four-to-eight per cent of head and neck cancer survivors who undergo radiation. ClinRad outperformed existing systems and is recommended as the staging system of choice by the American Society of Clinical Oncology expert panel for the prevention and management of osteoradionecrosis.

#### **IMPACT FACTOR: 9.4\***

Michael Glogauer's research paper *Discovery of phosphorylated lantibiotics with proimmune activity that regulate the oral microbiome* appeared in *The Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences USA* in 2023.

This study found lantibiotics produced by *Streptococcus salivarius*, a commensal bacterium in the human oral cavity, have antimicrobial properties against oral pathogens and biofilms and exhibit pro-immune activity. They could be used to target infectious pathogens while preserving the oral microbiota.

\*Impact Factor is the relative importance of a journal within its field; journals with higher impact factor values are given the status of being more important, or carry more prestige in their respective fields.
